The PE and Sport Premium is funding provided to schools to make additional, sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer. This can be used to:

- Develop or add to the PE and sport activities that the school already offers
- Make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years.

At St Mary's C.E. (A) Primary School when deciding on how to invest this primary school sport funding the Governors considered 2 important areas:-

- a) the impact that a high quality PE and school sport experience can make on young people's physical, social and cognitive development, their well-being and level of achievement.
- b) the need to increase the participation of competitive sport.

<p>Curriculum PE lessons</p> <p>An overhaul of the PE schemes of work and assessment systems was undertaken in the summer 2016/2017. An additional PE scheme of work (Brian Coates) was purchased to supplement the schemes we already had in place.</p> <p>Oldham Sport's Development Department offer PE delivery for an extra 30% of PE lessons during the Spring Term. We have utilised the specialist dance teachers at Sport's Development for this provision in the last 2 years. This is an advantage of paying to become an affiliated school.</p> <p>Brand new 'Balanceability' scheme for Reception children, helping them to do training on balance bikes. (through affiliated school's money)</p> <p>Specialist PE teacher (Mrs Kipling) plans and leads 30% of school PE lessons during the whole year. Classes rotate half termly to benefit from the specialist teaching. Class teachers watch lessons for professional development. They are also involved in the delivery of the lessons.</p>	<p>'Joined-up' scheme provides much more consistency, continuity and progression across the key stages.</p> <p>High quality PE lessons delivered by specialists. Pupils are receiving specialist teaching. Children to make good or outstanding progress.</p> <p>New opportunities for the youngest children to become more physically literate.</p> <p>High quality PE lessons delivered by specialists. <p>Extra-curricular activities:</p> <p>Pupils have access to a wide range of extra-curricular activities including netball, basketball, football, lacrosse, dance, cricket and cross country (Co-ordinated and mostly led by Mrs Kipling) PE teacher and PE co-ordinators have opportunity to raise profile of PE in school through increased participation.</p> <p>Lunch time clubs in basketball and netball run throughout the year and are offered to different age groups.</p> <p>After school sports clubs include Lacrosse, Netball and Football.</p> <p>G&T Dance club at lunchtime and after school by invitation to a group of 12 talented dancers in Y4, 5 &6.</p> <p>Cross country training on Saturdays for pupils and cross country events staffed by PE teacher.</p> <p>Newly established half-termly PE assemblies provide an opportunity to celebrate PE achievements both in and out of school</p> <p>Sport's clubs outside school are promoted and signposted to all pupils and especially where potential is spotted.</p>	<p>Children gain access to sports clubs which improves their skills and helps them maintain physical activity throughout the day.</p> <p>Pupils from all year groups have access to sports clubs. Wide variety of Sports clubs to suit all ages.</p> <p>Talented children are given the chance to excel as they work towards a dance competition and compete against other Oldham schools.</p> <p>Children get to train and improve fitness levels.
