

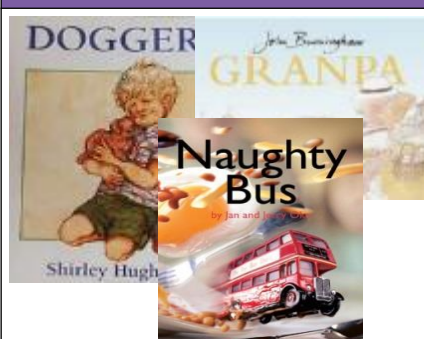
Toys – Past & Present: Life Within Living Memory – Year 1

Subject Specific Vocabulary

past	A period in time in which something has already happened.
present	The time period that is happening right now.
toy	An object for a child to play with.
old	Something from the past/earlier time.
new	Something produced, introduced or discovered recently or now for the first time.
modern	Something relating to the present or recent times, not the past.
entertainment	Something that can provide you with enjoyment, pleasure and amusement.
electronic	Something that using electricity to work.
develop	When something gets better/more advanced over time.

Sticky Knowledge about toys – past & present: life within living memory

- Civilisations from all points in time, from way back in history, and from all around the world, produced and played with different kinds of toys.
- Sometimes toys go through a 'craze' period when they are popular – like the hula hoop in the 1950s or rollerblades in the 1990s.
- Toys changed a lot after TV was invented: many were based on TV shows that children watch – this still happens today!
- Corporal punishment was still implemented in schools in the 1980s – children used to get the slipper, pump and ruler if they were to misbehave.
- Teddy bears were named after President Theodore 'Teddy' Roosevelt.
