We have lots of exciting learning to fit into the next few weeks and I have no doubt that the children are going to do this brilliantly.

Staffing

Topic

Science (Biology - plants) 'How did that blossom become an apple?'

Our topic focus this term is heavily Science based, and will be looking into the following areas;

- Know the function of different parts of flowing plants and trees
- Know how water is transported within plants.
- Know the plant life cycle, especially the importance of flowers.

The children will have the opportunity to explore this topic through science, ICT research, design technology and art. I have planned in lots of practical, outdoor learning for this topic – so please keep your fingers crossed that the weather is in our favour!

English

She meets and befriends a local boy, the talented Dickon, and comes across her cousin Colin who had been kept hidden from her. Between them, the three children work astonishing magic in themselves and those around them.

Mathematics

Topic Area focus 1: Length and Perimeter

- Measure and compare length in any direction (m/cm/mm)
- Add and subtract length (m/cm/mm)
- Measure the perimeter of simple 2-D shapes

Topic Area focus 2: Fractions

- Count up and down in tenths
- Recognise that tenths arise from dividing an object into ten equal parts and in dividing 1-digit numbers or quantities by 10
- Recognise, find and write fractions of numbers using unit and non-unit fractions
- Recognise and show, using diagrams, equivalent fractions with small denominators

Multiplications

- Count in multiples of 8
- Count in multiples of 4
- Count in multiples of 9
- Count in multiples of 11

Unit of work: 4.4 Exploring Easter as a story of betrayal and trust

- Focus on the significance of the incidents of betrayal and trust in the Easter story

The children will learn about how to keep their bodies and minds healthy, learning between safe and unsafe situations and what fitness means to them. There will be written tasks and practical activities linked

to this and we are really looking forward to exploring this unit of work.

- Children will bring home their scores and a list of any words they may have found tricky
- Please ensure that your child brings their spelling folder in each Friday so that I can check they have completed their activities linked to their spelling list

Friday: Reading Diaries

 Children are encouraged to read each day for ten minutes minimum at home, in addition to the reading they complete in school

- If your child is on the reading scheme at school, we will send home an appropriate book for them to read. Please return this to school each Friday so that we are able to monitor their progress
- Please complete the weekly reading diary with information of which book they are reading, any words they found difficult and if they enjoyed the book. I will be looking at these diaries each Friday and will set additional tasks if required – ALL CHILDREN RECEIVED A NEW READING DIARY AT THE START OF THIS HALF TERM.

Thursday: Multiplications

- Mrs Meadham will be leading the multiplication tests with the children each Thursday
- She is starting with revising 2, 5 and 10 times tables, and will gradually increase this as the children demonstrate their progress on each set
- Please ensure that your child brings their multiplication folder in each Thursday
