



The Industrial Revolution was a time in British history where the country changed hugely from a mostly rural society to an industrial one. This means that many British people moved from living in small towns and villages, where they were farmers, to huge cities, where they worked in places such as factories or mills. It also meant society changed from being based on manufacturing by hand and human or animal power, to a society based on machinery.</p> </div>	<p>Can you write historical texts in role?
